Healing the Wounds

24-Hour Family Helpline – Crisis calls, general information on parenting and referrals to community resources or Bellflower Center programs.

Tot-Line – Child development information for parents and caregivers of children birth through six years.

Individual Counseling – For both adults and children who were abused, and for parents seeking treatment for their own family issues.

Child Therapy Group – A 12-week program that provides counseling for children ages 6-12 who have experienced sexual abuse.

Adult Survivors Group Therapy – Provides adults who were abused as children a forum to address the issues they face, including anger management and parenting their own children.

Kinship Care Home Visiting – In-home program for grandparents and other caregivers—and for the children in their care—to deal with the trauma and other issues they face.

Teen Parent Group – A therapeutic group focusing on the dual roles of teen parents. Discussions center on relationships, boundaries and other concerns of teen parents.

Teen Parenting Program – Support, education, personal development and life skills for teens who are parenting.

Parent Education Programs – Education and support for parents addressing topics such as discipline, anger management, family-of-origin issues, communication and cooperation.

Help Me Grow Program – Home visiting for families with children from birth to three years, providing guidance, other parenting information, and developmental screening at regular intervals.

Personal Safety Skills Programs – Educating school children on how to stay safe and what to do if they do not feel safe—with a component for teachers and childcare workers.

Training and Education – Child abuse recognition and reporting, and other child development topics. For children's service providers, administrators, parents and anyone who spends time with children.
